Dr Toni Weller is currently a Visiting Research Fellow in History, formerly Senior Lecturer, at De Montfort University, Leicester. She holds degrees in History and Information Science from the Universities of Cambridge and City, University of London, respectively, and has long been an advocate on information history as a field of study. She has published and lectured on a wide variety of information history aspects, from the information culture of Victorian etiquette to the history of the surveillance state. She is also highly interested in the study and practice of history in the digital age, acting as a consultant on the City University of New York based project, *Beyond Citation*, and her book, *History in the Digital Age*, has become a key set text across digital history courses in North America. Dr Weller is a former editor of the international journal, *Library & Information History*, a former Chair of the UK *Library & Information History Group*, and sits on numerous editorial boards. Her publications include *Information History: An Introduction* (2008), *The Victorians and Information* (2009), *Information History in the Modern World* (2010) and *History in the Digital Age* (2012).
